AMENDED SECURITY ORDER

In order to ensure proper decorum in the courthouses and courtrooms at all times, it is this 8th day of October, 2004, by the Circuit Court for Baltimore City, Part 20,

ORDERED as follows:

1. The deputy sheriffs assigned to Part 20 for these proceedings shall establish limited reserved seating in the courtroom for authorized media, members of the victim’s family, members of the defendants’ families and representatives of the Baltimore City Police Department.
2. All persons attending trial shall first be subjected to security screening of their persons and belongings at the entrances to the courthouses. Press credentials do not exempt members of the media from screening for security purposes.
3. The Baltimore City Sheriff’s Office shall provide appropriate press credential identification to a limited number of members of the media for purpose of attendance at trial.

4. The deputy sheriffs shall not permit any demonstrations inside the courthouse. No one attending this trial shall be permitted to congregate outside the courtroom (within 50 feet of the entrance) during the course of this trial. Offenders shall be removed from the courthouse.
5. The deputy sheriffs shall monitor the courtroom at all times and they are authorized to remove anyone who violates this Security Order, the Media Protocol Order dated 12/22/03 or at the instruction of the Court. Press credentials will be rescinded from members of the media who violate these orders. All violators shall be referred to the Court for appropriate sanctions.
6. The deputy sheriffs shall accompany the courtroom clerk assigned to Part 20 to the media room whenever trial evidence is displayed there pursuant to the terms of the Media Protocol Order dated 12/22/03.
7. The deputy sheriffs shall escort the members of the jury from the courthouse at the conclusion of trial each day and shall provide the jurors with information on available downtown escort services beyond the courthouse. The deputy sheriffs shall apprehend anyone attempting to interfere with the members of the jury and refer them to the Court for appropriate sanctions.

8. This Security Order is subject to modification by the Court at any time.
